## DRAFT TRAFFIC REGULATION ORDER PROPOSALS FOR ATCHAM

Atcham Parish Council have agreed to consult on a Traffic Regulation Order (TRO). The proposals are to install double yellow lines on the Atcham to Cross Houses Road and in the bus shelters and the Malthouse Lane junction. The Parish Council are also proposing to put two advisory "keep clear" white lines on the two junctions for the turning to the Malthouse Car Park and also The Glebe. # 'Beware of Gorillas'

A duo exhibition of works on paper

26th-29th June at Berrington Village Hall



Did any of you go to the primary schools at Berrington or Cressage? If so you will probably remember the headmaster Mr Sharpe and his wife Mrs Sharpe who was a teaching assistant at both schools.

Tony and Sheila met in the 1950s on the Gower peninsular in Wales. Sheila was working locally and Tony was hiking and camping on the beach with a sign 'beware of gorillas' written in Latin stuck on his tent. Sheila had an immediate awareness that she would marry him, which proved to be correct!

In 1966 they moved to Berrington for Tony to take up the post of headmaster of Berrington School. Sheila worked in the school as a teaching assistant and they lived in the old schoolhouse with their children Peter and Elizabeth until 1972 when Tony became the headmaster of Cressage School.

They look back at this time with great affection. It was a beautiful place to live with many opportunities to go for walks over Birch Hill and around the village, and fishing in Berrington Pool and in what was the pond by the Manor Farm.

Both Tony and Sheila Sharpe have been prolific artists over the years and now they would like to share their visual life with you in an exhibition of their work at Berrington Village Hall. Everything in the exhibition will be for sale, apart from Tony and Sheila, who will be delighted to see old friends and grown up school children. All profits will be donated to Severn Hospice.

## Parking issues and roads

Thank you to everyone who took the time to respond to the questionnaire about the proposed parking restrictions (and to the parish councillors and volunteers who delivered them to every household). We had a good response. There was no overwhelming majority, but by a small margin people favoured Option 1 – which was just having parking restrictions at the junctions, bus stops, and on Cross Houses Lane. Therefore, the parish council has resolved to go ahead with implementing this. They have also agreed to put in two sets of H-markings on the road at key congestion points on Malthouse Lane. Full details (and a full report on the questionnaire responses) can be found on our website.

## Mytton & Mermaid extra parking

We have no update at present, except to say that the pre-app stage is underway. We will share information when we have it.

## New benches

The parish council had resolved to purchase a new bench for by the bus stop, but when we approached National Trust Attingham for permission to install it, we were offered two brand new wooden benches as a donation from NT. These were put in place very quickly, including ground-anchoring and the transfer of the commemorative plaques on the bus stop bench. (A replica of an historical plaque owned by NT will eventually be put onto the second bench by the main gates). The new benches are of lovely quality and should last a good while. We are very grateful to NT Attingham for this generous donation.

## Atcham Airfield Memorial

There was a good turnout for the unveiling of the new memorial on 11<sup>th</sup> April. If you haven't seen it, do go and have a look (at the entrance to Atcham Industrial Estate). It's a fitting tribute to RAF Atcham and all who served there. The unveiling ceremony was also one of the last official duties of our former Chairman, Colin Wildblood, who has now retired from the parish council after many years of service to the community. Our new Chair is Laura Dixon, with Keith Daley serving as Vice Chair.

## Proposed footpath

At the Annual Community Meeting, those present considered the suggestion for a community-linking permissive path joining Atcham and Cross Houses. There were many points raised, including quite a few challenging aspects to the proposal, but in

general everyone was in support of the idea. (The proposal document is on our website).

### Speeding on Emstrey Bank

The parish council will be making every effort to tackle this issue. SC Cllr Claire Wild has suggested a formal request to Shropshire Council for the speed limit to be reduced to 40mph between Emstrey roundabout and Atcham.

### Resurfacing and white line painting

The patching work has been carried out on the Berwick Wharf road. It is scheduled to be resurfaced in June, when lining will be reinstated. Shropshire Council tells us that Keir have been instructed to reinstate the white lines at the village junctions, but we have no projected date as yet.

# Practice News

## Access to Health Care

As patients we are all aware of the pressures on the NHS. To help manage the demand we are asked to consider which service is most appropriate for our needs.

Primary Care Services have developed significantly over the years and whilst we will always need General Practitioners, there are other clinicians who are able to provide treatment and care that don't require a patient to see or speak to a GP. Details of some of the services available are listed below.

**Minor Eye Conditions Service** – contact your local optician and ask if they provide the service. Conditions treated:

- Dry, gritty, irritable and uncomfortable eyes
- Superficial foreign bodies in the eye
- Red eye or eyelids
- In-growing eyelashes
- Recent and sudden changes in vision
- Flashes and floaters

**Pharmacy First** – speak to your local pharmacist to arrange an appointment to discuss any of the following conditions:

- sinusitis.
- sore throat.
- earache.
- infected insect bites.
- impetigo.
- shingles.
- uncomplicated urinary tract infections in women.

**Clinical Pharmacist** – bookable directly through the Practice

- Medication queries
- Medication reviews

**First Contact Physiotherapist** – bookable directly through the Practice

- Assessment of soft tissue, muscle and joint pain

# PRACTISE NEWS continued

For advice and treatment that does require a consultation with a GP we offer:

- Telephone appointments
- Face to face appointments
- Online Triage requests (via our website)
- Extended Access appointments (see information below)\*
- Home Visits – where appropriate

Appointments are available on the day and one or two weeks in advance. We also have a number of appointments available for GP's to book follow up appointments for those patients needing further review, to improve continuity of care.

\*For patients requiring appointments outside normal Practice hours, there are appointments provided on weekday evenings and some Saturdays by our neighbouring Practices within the South East Shropshire Primary Care Network. Patients can book these Extended Access appointments by contacting a member of the Reception team at the Practice.

In addition to the above the GP's are supported by our team of Practice Nurses and Health Care Assistants who provide a wide range of services including long term condition management, (such as asthma/diabetes), blood tests, ECG's, cervical screening, wound care management etc.

## Did Not Attend (DNA) – Appointments

Reducing the number of "lost" appointments due to patient non attendance would help the Practice increase appointment availability.

In April 2024 alone we had **149** DNA's; equating to approximately 5 days of GP or Nurse appointments.

If you are unable to attend an appointment or no longer require your booked appointment, please contact the Practice as soon as possible to give someone else the opportunity to book. Thank you.

**Carer Connect Group:** Is a support group dedicated to our unpaid carers. It provides an opportunity to meet other carers and to connect with support services within the community. **Time and date:** First Tuesday of the month 2pm – 4pm. Booking is essential.

At our May meeting 31 members and visitors heard a fascinating talk from Phillipa Cooper entitled 'Sweet Success'. Phillipa, and her husband John, are both members of the Eckford Sweet Pea Society and their enthusiasm for sweet peas was quite obvious. Phillipa grows 'Old Fashioned' sweet peas and John specialises in the 'Spencer' variety. We learned a little about the history of Henry Eckford and how he initially developed different sweet peas. Then we heard about the vast range of Sweet peas varieties which are now available, quite different from the varieties many of us are familiar with. Phillipa also gave us advice on how to successfully germinate the seeds, how to plant and care for them to gain beautiful flowers. They both show their flowers at a number of shows around the country and have won many prizes. We wish them both continued success in all their future shows.

We will be holding our annual Plant Sale on Saturday 25th May which, this year, will be held at Cressage Village Hall between 10-12am.

### A rich curriculum!
