Car repairs can be a costly part of running a vehicle. To save money some people buy replacement parts for their car themselves and then take them to a garage to fit. However a recent survey by Intellectual Property Office found 1 in 6 motorists had bought counterfeit parts.

Fake parts can be made from inferior materials and are not safety-tested, increasing the risk of failure. Read more here - Consumer guidance fake parts - GOV.UK

⚠ We have received 13 reports of Police impersonation scams known as 'courier fraud' across Kent.

The scam involves a resident being called and told there is criminal activity on their bank card or account. The criminal impersonates a police officer or detective and may say the residents:

- Bank card had been cloned
- Cash withdrawn using their card
- Money had been spent on their card
- Assistance was needed to catch a bank staff member committing fraud
- Relative had been arrested using fake i.d.
- Bank account had fraudulent activity

They are told to call the police, or a courier will be sent to collect their cards, or asked to make a large cash withdraw for collection later.

Often the criminals tell you to call the police to confirm this story but they stay on the line.

- This is a scam! If a courier arrives at your property ring 999.
- ➤ The Police would NEVER telephone and ask for your bank card and pin number to be collected by a courier, withdraw cash, or buy gold to assist in an investigation.
- Always check the dialing tone after your call to ensure scammers are not still on the phone, use another telephone if possible or call a trusted friend first.
- Watch 'Courier Fraud Warning: Stay Wise, Don't Compromise'

f you think that you may have been a victim of this or any other type of scam, then contact your bank immediately, which you can do by calling 159 and report to Kent Police on 101.

⚠ We have received reports of doorstep criminals in Faversham.

They are cold calling residents and showing a video on their phone of a damaged roof. They claim this is your roof and they can carry out urgent repairs for you. They offer a price to do this - if you refuse, they then lower the price.

- X Never respond to cold callers!
- Doorstep criminals (also known as rogue traders, cowboy builders, building and gardening scammers) cold call on unsuspecting households offering convincing deals to try to get you to agree to having work carried out. We know that if you accept work from a doorstep criminal you'll pay much more than you intended for very poor, unnecessary and sometimes dangerous work.
- Learn how to protect yourself from doorstep criminals
- ✓ Always get three quotes and use a safe, local trader that's been vetted by <u>Kent</u> Trading Standards
- Look out for others, report to Kent Police on 101. You can also report it to the charity Crimestoppers on 0800 555 111. You'll stay 100% anonymous, always.

⚠ Criminals impersonating Superdrug via email that sends you to fake website.

- A scam email which claims to be from Superdrug tells you that you can receive an Oral B electric toothbrush in exchange for answering a few questions. The email invites you to click on a malicious link which leads to a dodgy website asking for your personal and payment information.
- We are all vulnerable to scams, be wary and think twice. NEVER give out your personal or financial information.
