Cllr Bennett – reported there is dog mess along the pavement at Dorset Park (clerk will report).

Cllr Law – requests for a dog bin at the end of Underlane (clerk will submit request and put a notice on the website urging people to pick up after their dogs, and ask people not to use the salt bin for this purpose).

Cllr Willetts – noted the bus shelter bench had been repaired. Gilbert has cleaned it out. Queried whether the person interested in doing the garden plots still was (clerk to place on the May agenda).

Cllr Willetts also downloaded the date from the speed indicator sign. One evening, 7.43pm on April 12, someone was driving at 88mph in the village. He noted that there are several travelling at 60mph, with 107 doing more than 50mph over a six-week period, and 1,125 doing between 41mph and 45mph. Cllr Willets will download date and pass to the clerk so that the information can be circulated and publicised. She will also let Cornwall Council and the police know.
