### News from St. Nicholas Church – July 2024

At last! This weekend we have had sunshine and warm weather. Maybe it will last a little while to lighten our spirits, even our clothing perhaps. Shook the spiders and cobwebs from the garden umbrella for the first time this year. One very large spider remained rigid, with surprise, no doubt. Yesterday we welcomed friends from around the benefice for a combined Sunday service at St Nicolas, with Rev. John Huggins preaching on the theme of Jesus as the Good Shepherd. As always, this subject seems so relevant to us in our rural surroundings, with sheep and lambs on the doorstep. Our visitors always comment on and appreciate the beauty of the landscape we can so often take for granted.

### Reminders

The church porch remains open at all times, with the opportunity to make a hot drink and relax. There is a bible on the windowsill to dip into and cards for prayer requests. Any requests will be prayed for during Monday morning prayer time in the church. Make use of the mini-food bank if you need. There is a larger food bank in St. Mary's church in Lenham, open daily from 10am-4pm.

The main church building is open for services, cleaning, meetings etc. please contact the churchwardens for a key if you wish to visit at other times.

Church service times are on the noticeboards by the porch, by the roadside and outside the village hall in Grafty Green.

Celtic Morning Prayer is said in the side chapel each Monday morning, 9.00am-9.30am. This is an informal time with short bible readings and time for prayer, spoken or in silence, for people, world problems and worries. A comfortable and special time to start the week.

The monthly time of meditation, on the first Saturday, is taking a break in the summer and will return in the autumn. Will keep you posted.

Village Coffee Morning takes place every Tuesday, 11.30am-2.00pm in the village hall in Grafty Green. The Post Office is usually open there from 12.45-2.15pm. There are often items for sale, free range eggs, local honey and fruit in season, teas, jams, marmalade, handmade cards etc. All donations for the tea/coffee and cakes are shared equally between the church and a charity, or cause, chosen by the 'regulars'. £100 was recently given to help fund a project in Platts Heath Primary school and a selection of thank-you letters from the children was displayed in the hall last week. They were delightful.

#### News

The commemoration of the D-day landings of 80yrs ago was well supported on June 6th. Many thanks for the funding from the Parish Council and the hard work of the team in organising the event. The display of photos, information and even a few tins of Spam, in the church, was a real talking point while we enjoyed the generous supper, before taking our candles and walking down to the Old Rectory for the lighting of the beacon. The national commemorative reading was given by John Collins. The evening ended with a recording of the Last Post. In the evening light, it seemed, for many older local people, especially poignant, as so many thousands of troops had passed through this area, camping in our fields and woods, before leaving for France.

On 16th June the congregation welcomed Lucy and Jake's son Freddie into the church family at his baptism. Such a privilege to join friends and family in celebrating the occasion, always a joy to have the company of all ages together.

## **Grafty Gourmet**

# Frozen Chocolate & Cherry Trifle

1 tin of black cherries in syrup (about 400g) 150ml <u>of</u> whipping cream 80g of chocolate brownies 200g of dark chocolate chopped 150g of mascarpone cheese 2 tablespoons of icing sugar

1. Line a 900g loaf tin or terrine with baking parchment. Tip the cherries into a sieve over a saucepan and drain off the syrup. Bring the syrup to a boil and simmer until it thickens and is reduced by half, about 5 mins, and stir back in the cherries. Spoon the cherries and syrup into the base of the tin and leave to cool.

2. Whip half of the cream until it thickens but is not stiff, spoon this in a layer over the cherries. Cut the brownies into pieces and make a layer on top of the cream. Melt 100g chocolate carefully in a small pan and leave to cool a little.

3. Tip the mascarpone cheese into a bowl and add the remaining cream and the icing sugar, whisk together with electric whisk until they are just combined and the mixture is thick, stir in the melted chocolate. Spoon the chocolate mixture on top and smooth the surface. Put the trifle into the fridge for 30 mins.

4. Melt the remaining chocolate in the same way, leaving to cool a little and pour it onto the trifle, tip the loaf tin back and forth to make a thin, even layer. Wait for the chocolate to set and then cover the tin or terrine and put it into the freezer. Freeze for up to 1 week.

5. To serve, take the tin or terrine out of the freezer and leave it to sit for 10 mins, then tip it out onto a serving plate. The syrup from the cherries will run down the sides a little, leave the trifle to sit for another 20 mins before cutting into slices to serve.



On **July 2nd** we are invited to visit the Hands of Hope Farm and Community Garden at Moor Hill, Hawkhurst TN18 4QB. Start time is 6. 30. Mandy Doran is willing to show us around if we wish.

Our club visit in June was to the very interesting and pretty garden of Bridget Samuelson. It rained a bit but this did not stop many of us viewing the garden and hearing of the plans and challenges being undertaken in part of the farm. The hedges looked beautiful with the wild roses left to grow to full size through them. Our landscape is in good hands if this is the future for our precious countryside!

In our gardens : - A few tasks to be getting on with !

- Prune shrubs that flower in early summer.
- · Protect house plants from direct sunlight.
- Sew any left-over courgette or beetroot seeds to keep harvesting till Autumn.
- Trim conifer hedges and take cuttings.
- Plant out winter brassicas.
- · Plant Autumn flowering bulbs and order Spring ones.

## Sue's nature notes

### The Green-veined white butterfly.

A fairly small butterfly that can be mistaken for Small Whites but it's under surfaces are a yellowish green and the hind wings are veined in a darker green. Generally they like a sheltered, partial shade, damp grass situations.

Pupating in early spring, having overwintered in vegetation and leaf litter, this butterfly will feed on the nectar of Bluebells, Buttercups, Lady's Smock and Greater Stitchwort and caterpillars can be found on Lady's Smock and Garlic Mustard.

They have two broods a year so later specimens can be found on Knapweed, Red and Pink Campion as well as vetches with the caterpillars feeding on Nasturtiums, Honesty and Sweet Rocket.

For reasons that are complex but too boring to mention, I am writing this Christian Message way early, and it made me reflect, 'What is July famous for'.

Apparently, Lord Byron once said of July it is the month when English winter ends, only to recommence in August. Hmm. July is also of course the month when school summer holidays start, so it's a month of waiting for that point to come. It's also a month when exam-takers wonder how well they have done before the results come out.

There are also some odd special days in July. 3<sup>rd</sup> July is, "International Plastic Bag Free Day", which sounds a good idea. And 7<sup>th</sup> July is, "Tell the Truth Day", which makes me wonder whether somebody somewhere thinks it's just fine to lie all the rest of the time! But it gets even more obscure! 15<sup>th</sup> is, "Gummi Worm Day" and 24<sup>th</sup> is, "Tell an old joke day". But my favourite is the 28<sup>th</sup>, which is "Milk Chocolate Day"- not Easter Day, after all!

But after all these, comes the day in the church when we remember one of my personal heroes. On 30<sup>th</sup> July, we remember William Wilberforce. Now there's an interesting person. He was very much a committed Christian, and considered being ordained but was persuaded that a career in politics could do better. Along with a group of people in London called the, "Clapham Sect", they campaigned for years and years against all the political elite and economic powers of the time to abolish slavery.

Wilberforce was not only required to fight against vested interested, but also against his own personal heath, which was never very strong. There was setback after setback, but in the end, they got there, and the vile practice of human slavery- which recked families, killed millions, displaced millions and stigmatised people because they were born without a white skin- was finally over. Except, the fight goes on, because human trafficking is such a major problem today.

But in the summery month of July, remember Wilberforce: an example of resilient, persistent, determined, Christian action.

How we need Wilberforce equivalents to fight the evils of our current age!
