Aviva Tour of Britain almost comes to Hognaston

Stage 6 of The Aviva Tour of Britain, British Cycling's premier road race and the UK's biggest professional bicycle race, will be passing through the Derbyshire Dales on Friday 11th September. The route comes very close to Hognaston – along the dam wall road – on its way from Stoke-on-Trent to Nottingham; estimated timings for this bit of the route are between 1350 and 1430. Spectating is completely free of charge and the dam wall should provide the perfect vantage point (and is within easy walking distance for most).

The redevelopment of the Play Area is now well under way. The Multi-Use Games Area (a fenced and surfaced area suitable for ball-play) has now been completed and is in use. The next phase will see the replacement of the current swings with a cradle-swing for small children and a saucer-swing for those up to age 14; a multiplay unit for small children will also be erected in the lower part of the Play Area. This work should take place within the next two months. [Unfortunately the current cradle-swing has had to be removed from use owing to deterioration of one of the wooden supports.]

Bulk Oil Buy from Chris Stait

Thanks to the twenty-one households in the village who joined in with this year's bulk oil purchase. We saved about eighteen lorry trips to the village and 9.5% over the Boiler Juice prices at the time of order – the cheapest oil buy since 2005. In the end I ran out of nerve

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hanging on for yet more price drops (lower summer prices do not normally last this long) and some people were running short. Even so people ordering individually now will still not be getting their oil cheaper than the bulk order price. Looking forward to next year and even more villagers joining in.

Hognaston Harvest Horkey from Dave Jackson

The Hognaston Harvest Horkey returns on Saturday 26th September (7.15PM at the Village Hall). As on previous occasions this will be a Barn Dance, with top-notch music and calling provided by Rachel's Celebration Band. HogWalks

Public Rights of Way consultation from David Lucas

In response to further reductions in funding from central Government, inflation and greater demands on areas of their budget for adult social care and vulnerable children the County Council is rethinking the way it delivers a range of services. As part of this the countryside service is required to make a saving of £1m and a proportion of this amount needs to be found from the rights of way budget (around £163K or a third of the rights of way budget).

The rights of way team is a small group of people who manage the rights of way network — the footpaths, bridleways, restricted byways and byways open to all traffic across the county. The proposals to save money involve revising the targets set out in the Rights of Way Charter (basically allowing more time to respond to issues raised, carry out work etc.) and reducing staff.

Mainly through HogWalks, the Parish has had considerable help from the countryside service and the rights of way team and I would encourage people to have their say. The deadline for comment is either the 13th or the 20th September (depending on whether you go by the first page of the survey that you are asked to express your views through or the last).

More walking from Rachel Bolton

I have organised a guided walk to raise funds for Derbyshire Air Ambulance on Saturday 19th September.

We will start at 10.00AM from Grindleford train station and cover Froggatt, Curbar and Baslow edges before returning along the banks of the River Derwent, via Baslow village (for a 'comfort break').

The total distance is 17 kilometres (10.5 miles) and the walk should take around 6 hours. Good walking shoes or boots are required, plus water proofs and a warm fleece or jumper.

Health & Safety-wise, I am a qualified summer mountain leader which, amongst other things, means that I need to think about numbers (there will be a maximum of 15 walkers to keep things manageable); I also have a first aid certificate.

The walk is suitable for all ages and mainly fairly level apart from a steady uphill walk at the start to reach Froggatt Edge and a shorter downhill stretch at the other end to get to Baslow. There are various refreshment opportunities during the walk (including a wonderful vintage coffee van at Curbar car park) but please also bring sufficient food and water with you.

HogLit - Hognaston's Book Club from Stephanie Taylor

In July we discussed 'The Dead Place' by Stephen Booth, an author who locates his crime thrillers in Derbyshire. It was full of recognisable local references but didn't give us much of a thrill, unfortunately. We intend to choose another crime novel in the future.

Currently, we are reading 'The Yellow Birds' by Kevin Powers who won the 2012 Guardian first book award for his disturbing account of military service in Iraq and its impact on those involved in the conflict. He served there himself and has evoked the haunting terrors of war in this stunning book. It's relatively short – so still time to read it before joining us on 8th September to talk it over. We'd love to hear your views.

After 'The Yellow Birds' our next book, for discussion on October 13th, is 'The Diving Bell and the Butterfly' by Jean-Dominique Bauby. This is his true account of life before and after a devastating stroke which left him almost totally paralysed and with locked-in syndrome – the entire book was written by Bauby blinking his left eyelid (one blink for an 'e'; two for an 's' etc.). Robert McCrum in The Observer wrote: "...what he says goes to the core of what it means to be human." The library can't supply this one for us so you will need to buy it.
