Minutes of Parish Council Meeting.

Apologies were tendered on Mr. Payne's behalf by the Chairman: ill-health and a consequent appointment with the doctor had prevented him from attending.)

Minutes of the previous meeting were read, confirmed & signed.

Old peoples }
Bungalows } The Chairman opened the meeting by explaining that the R. D. C. were anxious to know whether the Thelbridge Parish Council felt that there was a need for, and a reasonable likelihood of letting, two old peoples bungalows, were they to be erected at Romansland. Extracts from the R. D. C.'s proceedings indicated that, by an agreement with the Tiverton R. D. C., main sewage would be available under the proposed Linnys Marchard sewage scheme, which already included the existing four Thelbridge houses and could be extended to deal with two further houses if necessary and if Crediton were prepared to pay an additional 1/5 of the capital outlay + £12/10 per annum for maintenance etc. provided that we could reach a decision now.

A discussion followed during which it was agreed that there should be no difficulty in letting 2 houses or bungalows at Romansland, even though there might not necessarily be applicants from Thelbridge. It was decided to recommend that the two bungalows be built forthwith.

Blind corners/
Crediton Lane }

Mr. H. R. Cole raised the matter of the blind corner in Crediton Lane just above the new bridge at Woodcombe Water. The road-surface improvements had resulted in an increase in traffic speed at this point and he had heard of no less than eight near accidents

before there would be a serious accident. These facts were confirmed by other members and it was agreed that Mr. Smith be requested to raise the matter at the next R. D. C. meeting.
