Eco Schools Green Flag Award We've done it!

At the start of 2011, Wrockwardine Wood Infant School & Nursery is celebrating after receiving the prestigious Eco Schools Green Flag Award in recognition of its environmental efforts. This is a great achievement after three years hard work.

The Eco Schools programme, which leads to this prestigious international environmental award, is a learning resource that raises awareness of environmental issues through activities that are linked to many curriculum subjects. It also links in well with the government's Every Child Matters, Healthy Schools and School Travel Plan initiatives. Through the Eco Action Team, the school has tried to raise environmental awareness of topics such as biodiversity, litter, waste, energy, water, transport, healthy living and schools grounds. This has been achieved through Eco assemblies, an Eco notice board, school newsletters, competitions, etc.

Page 2: Eco Schools Award

Led by the Eco Action Team, the children have devised their own Eco Code which is on display in every classroom. The term 'Recycle, Reduce, Re-use' has involved children in a variety of projects over the last three years. They have taken on the responsibility for keeping the school grounds litter free with regular litter picks and by raising money to buy litter bins. They have even written to the local council about the problem of litter outside school.

While working towards the Green Flag, children have had the opportunity to work with and learn from other adults through its involvement with outside agencies such as Telford & Wrekin Council's Waste Education Support Programme (WESP). Children helped to carry out several waste audits to help our school to reduce the amount of waste, mainly through recycling. They now recycle fruit waste, vegetable peelings from the kitchen and staffroom waste, as well as recycling paper, card and plastic for the fortnightly red bin collection. Printer ink cartridges are collected and the children have helped with the recycling of clothing and mobile phones. They have also been involved from the planning stage in our project to improve our school grounds by building an adventure playground and with the development of our 'outdoor classroom'. Children now grow vegetables using compost from their own compost bins and water from their own water butts.

The Eco Action Team is also keen to save energy and have made their own labels for display around the school. These have had a positive effect and staff and pupils are now switching off lights, making sure taps are turned off and closing more doors and windows.

Eco-Schools is an international award programme that provides a framework for schools to help embed sustainability principles into school life. It operates in 46 countries worldwide involving more than 21,000 schools and 4,000 local councils – this represents more than six million students!

Green Flag status is awarded to schools that secure high achievement in the programme and is a recognised and respected eco-label for environmental education and performance. Success in the programme is a huge achievement.

By making sustainability and environmental issues part of the educational process at Wrockwardine Wood Infant School & Nursery, a sense of responsibility is embedded into the young people of our local area and shows that their actions can make a difference and will be recognised.

Once a school has been awarded the Green Flag it has to re-apply every two years. We are now committed to working towards our second Green Flag and the Eco Action Team is already formulating an Action Plan to take us forward in 2011.

Page 6: My Story - Rona Harris

Rona Harris continues her story on her memories of the local area.

My Story (January 2011)

Well here we are again, and may I begin with an apology for a spelling mistake in my previous article. I mentioned the pub in Wrockwardine wood as the 'Whitehouse', this of course should have read "The White Horse", my apologies for this error.

I will move on a little now with my memories, and I hope that some-one may have the same or similar to mine. As I told you, at the age of around eighteen to twenty I continued with my dancing nights, and we were at this time living in Ketley Bank, (Sunnyside Road to be precise). But I was still within easy reach of the buses, both to Wellington and also Brown's to Donnington.

The time came when the powers that be decided to close our office in Oakengates, it was 1949 and I was transferred to a recently opened Ministry of National Insurance Office in Ironbridge, this of course was long before "The Gorge" and the Victorian Town became so popular. I must confess that it was not my favourite place then. In the job I was doing, we did see so much poverty in that area, but so many good things have come out of the Gorge and the Victorian Town.

So much for all of that, my parents decided to sell the house in Ketley Bank, and they purchased one in Roseway in Wellington. At that time, my father was employed in the Ministry of National Insurance in the grade of Executive Officer, and he was always based in Wellington. My sister Sheila also worked in Wellington, so this was obvious to all to move and to live in that town.

I was loving my life at this time, I was out two nights a week dancing at the Majestic Ballroom in Wellington, and Sankeys' Ballroom in Hadley, we spent some nights at cinemas, and on lighter spring and summer nights on walks, or in cafes in Wellington and Oakengates, and of course The Cartwheel Café in Donnington------Oh Boy! All types of military personnel came there and it was great too.

But then my parents seemed to have "itchy feet" and it was decided yet again to move, so the house in Roseway had to go.

Now back into the Oakengates area, and my Dad bought a house on the Holyhead Road, it was not a particular favourite of mine and I never really did get used to living there. Anyway, time marches on, and my life was still good despite the fact that the house was the kind of a property that had a "forbidding" feeling about it, I think that maybe the lay-out of it reminded my Mum of the house in Derbyshire where she was born, and I detested that house so much also. So far as that goes it was a move and I think, doomed from the start. But you know, when I stop to think of my life in these times, as compared to today, we were happy with our cosy little cinemas, such as these in this area. I know the Grosvenor in Oakengates, and yes even the little Regent in Wrockwardine Wood were just something a bit special, and yes, I agree! The "back rows" were something a bit special too.

Back to reality, it is amazing really the difference in things we did and places we went and all in the name of enjoyment. It is a bit scary to me today to know just how today's youngsters "NEED" everything, but are so "NOT" prepared to do things for themselves, everything has to be done for them.

Please give me my time back again, I loved it and all that went with it, we made our own entertainment, and in turn really enjoyed all of it.

DOG FOULING!

Church Yard, Wrockwardine Wood. 
